Egypt	Egypt is a country in the Northeastern corner of Africa. Ancient Egypt was one of the earliest and most important civilizations in the world.		
River Nile	The Nile is the longest river in the world. It flows through Northeastern Africa for about 4,132 miles. The River Nile was essential for survival in Ancient Egypt.		
Pyramid	Pyramid A pyramid is a structure with four triangular sides. Long ago, Egyptians built giant pyramids as monuments to the pharaohs. The pyramids were also tombs for the pharaohs.		
Pharoah	The Pharaohs of Ancient Egypt were the supreme leaders of the land. They were like kings or emperors.		
Mummy Egyptians believed in life after death, and mummification, or the process of making a body into a mummy, was a way to prepare th body for that afterlife.			
Tutankhamun	Tutankhamun became pharaoh in 1336 BCE, at just nine years of age. He ruled until he was 18, in 1327 BCE, when he died suddenly. He is famous today because his tomb was left undisturbed for almost 3,000 years after his death.		
Cleopatra	Cleopatra was the Queen of Ancient Egypt.		
Desert	A desert is a large, sandy place that has very little rainfall.		
Hieroglyphics	Hieroglyphics is a writing system used by Ancient Egyptians that uses pictures and symbols instead of letters and words.		
Tomb	A tomb is a place in which you are buried when you die. The ancient Egyptians believed that life did not stop when you died. Rather, death was more like a temporary stop on your way to another place, a place they called the afterlife.
